Department for Education Update

Keeping Children Safe in Education 2019 (KCSIE) - Section 128 checks for governors - Action Required

Your attention is drawn to <u>part 3 of KCSIE</u> regarding safer recruitment and item 130 which explains that along with academy, free and independent schools, a section 128 direction disqualifies a person from holding or continuing to hold office as a governor of a maintained school.

Copyright licences for state schools in England – information

The Department for Education (DfE) buys copyright licences for all state-funded primary and secondary schools in England which cover schools for almost all their copyright requirements. This updated guidance provides information on copyright licences and how copyright affects schools.

Inspection Data Summary Report (IDSR) – Early Years to key Stage 4 – information

Exclusions – Governor Training and Development - information

Induction of Newly Qualified Teachers (NQTs) - information reminder

Academy and LA Maintained Boards' attention is drawn to the DfE <u>Statutory policies for schools and academy trusts</u>;

You will find that an NQT policy is required to be in place; there is also the recommendation for a scheduled annual review. Information, guidance and a model policy from the <u>NQT Induction and Support team</u> can also be found on Kelsi.

Link Governors – Statutory requirements - information

Governors and clerks should check the links below regarding the statutory requirement to have link governors/committees for both SEND and Safeguarding; there are currently no requirements beyond these 2 areas:

- SEND as set out in paragraph 6.3 of SEND code of practice
- Safeguarding as set out in paragraph 55 of Keeping children safe in education

Schools' Personnel Service model - HR policies for schools' updates - information reminder
